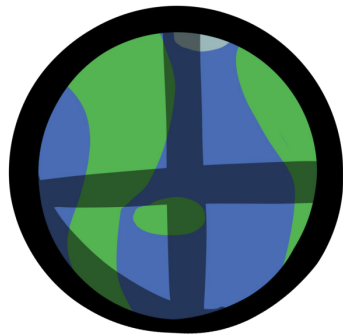

What is Toki Pona?

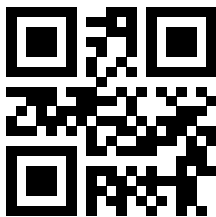
